What's in a Name? It Matters to 911!

The following are the proper names of roads to be used when calling 911 and for your mailing address. This information has been confirmed by The Municipality of the County of Antigonish and Canada Post:

- **Pomquet Monk's Head Road** is the paved road from Trans Canada Highway to where it ends at the Monk's Head Rd.
- Monk's Head Roadgravel road from Chez DesLaurier to the South Side Harbour Road.
- **Pomquet Beach Road** is the gravel road to the Provincial Park Beach.
- Pomquet Cove Road is the Cove Road.
- Pomquet Lake Road is the Lake Road from Taylor's Road to Pomquet Monk's Head Road.
- Pomquet Point Road is the road from Old Co-op to Back Road (the Vincent's residence).
- Pomquet Point One Road is the road from the sharp turn at Eddie Melanson's to the end.
- **Scout Camp** Road is the road to the old Boy Scout's Camp.
- Taylors Road, South Side Harbour Road, Melanson Road., Rock Point Road, Aveline Ave., Naveen Lane,
 Village Lane, Blueberry Island Road, Deyoung Road, Evangeline Lane, Heritage Road, Venedam Corner,
 Vincent Lane, and Dagger Woods Road are the correct names.
- Streets in Glenair Mobile Home Park use their road names posted in the park.
